### **ALEXIS FITZGERALD**

Alexis started painting in early childhood guided by Margaret Stokes when he received a 1<sup>st</sup> prize in the less than 18 year group by the RDS, at the age of six.

More recently, Alexis has been painting with under the guidance of Brian Byrnes since 2003 and in 2005 joined the 'Lambs Cross Artists' group, where he has had further guidance from Anne Marie Keaveney. His paintings have mainly been sold privately but he is now expanding that base. Alexis has exhibited with the Lambs Cross Artists and at an annual showing in the Leopardstown Park Hospital.

At the castle Park exhibition Alexis is presenting several works based on seascapes and water themes from both his native Blackrock and from the Wexford coast.
